

PSHEE Week

The children have enjoyed and participated in a wide range of activities to support their knowledge, skills and awareness of this important area of the curriculum. Our overarching focus has been on British Values. Thank you to the many volunteers and special visitors who have given their time to facilitate these activities. Special thanks must go to Mrs Davies for coordinating our PSHEE theme week.









Highlights of our PSHEE Week:

On Monday, the School Council held a pudding vote, the winning dessert was Pancakes, and Mr Potton visited Years 5 and 6. Mr Potton gave a really interesting presentation about Parliament. He explained the differences between the two houses, the roles and responsibilities of the MPs and how they voted. The children were given a chance to vote on some contentious issues and this resulted in some lively debate!

On Tuesday, Mr Gregory spoke to the whole of Key Stage 2. He explained the working of the Parish Council and how it contributes to our local democracy. The children had a lot of imaginative suggestions for improving the village and he encouraged them to keep in touch with the Parish Council!

On Wednesday, our new Year 5 Playleaders were introduced in assembly. After assembly, our new School Council completed their training and are now raring to go with various whole school projects - we will keep you updated about their work. In the afternoon, Key Stage One were visited by the inspirational author Hollie Hughes and all three classes took great delight in listening to several of her published works. Hollie also enjoyed her visit to Great Chesterford and has promised to return.

On Thursday, Mrs Tealby-Watson talked to Years 5 and 6 about her role as a District Councillor. She explained what her job involved e.g. campaigning for speed limits on the road to Great Chesterford. She then got the children to look at some different problems (e.g. whether a better cycle path could be put in place) and decide what order of importance they would rank them. She then explained which jobs were dealt with by Essex County Council and which jobs were dealt with by the District Council. In the afternoon we all

worked in our Friendship Groups and enjoyed taking part in various games led by our Playleaders. We have also produced a giant Union Jack depicting examples of how we demonstrate British Values in our daily lives at school.

On Friday, the school was ablaze with colour as everyone supported Children in Need dressed in red, white and blue. We are delighted to share that we have raised £230.71 for this charity - great team effort everyone! Even Lego Club supported Pudsey! Colour continued to be the theme in our exciting skipping event led by Dan where the children had fun working cooperatively whilst improving their fitness and learning new skipping games. We are all looking forward to watching the show at the end of the day! Mr Thomas, a Police Officer, visited Key Stage One; the children learnt how the police keep us safe in Britain and try to make sure that everyone follows the rule of law set by our Prime Minister.
