
Dear Parents,

Slapped Cheek Disease

There have been many cases of Slapped Cheek in Key Stage One. Early symptoms can include a sore throat, headache and high temperature followed by a bright red rash most often on the cheeks. Slapped Cheek is caused by a virus which is contagious before the rash develops. Please contact your GP if you have any concerns for your child's health.
