E-Safety - keeping your child safe online

Please may I remind parents that once children have been released to their parents at the end of the school day, teachers are no longer on 'duty' in the playground. Children should not play on the mound or play equipment in the absence of staff as we need to ensure their health and safety.

Scooters and bicycles

If your child travels to school by scooter or bicycle, please remind them to take care with road safety and pedestrians. Children should not ride their scooters or bicycles in the playground - thank you.

Road Safety

Please can you remind your child about the importance of road safety when walking to school. It was brought to my attention, that two pupils walking to school today walked out into the road without looking and were totally unaware of an approaching car. We have talked to Upper Key Stage 2 today in school about remaining alert when walking to school with friends and the importance of not being distracted or chatting when crossing roads.

They provide an invaluable contribution to our school community and I sincerely appreciate the time, effort and enthusiasm that you all generously provide in sharing your many talents and skills.
