# **Tag Rugby Tournament**




An outstanding result for our Year 6 rugby players this week when they won the SSP Newport Family Tag Tournament at Joyce Frankland Academy. There were 8 local teams competing in two pools. Our team won all three of their initial matches and continued undefeated in both the semi-final and final match against Clavering. All wins were comprehensive to the point where they stopped counting the tries in the semi-final! The whole team played exceptionally well with fantastic teamwork and sportsmanship; individuals gave up opportunities for points if they thought their team-mate had a better chance of scoring and gave the ball away for others to score a try. Their behaviour was excellent too - one referee made a point of commenting on just how polite the children were.

Thank you to Mrs Balchin and Mrs Trigg for accompanying the players and a special thank you to Mr Duers, whose training sessions prepared the children so well - all members of the team commented on how it had helped them really focus for the matches. We will keep you updated with their performance in the next round.

## Year 2 Trip to Cambridge

Class 2 enjoyed an action-packed day during their class visit to Cambridge this week. The morning was spent at Pizza Express where Class 2 learnt how to stretch the dough to fit the pizza tray after learning what ingredients are used to prepare the dough. They then put on the tomato sauce and cheese - this makes a Margherita Pizza which is the Queen of the pizzas. This pizza has protein, carbohydrates and vegetable food groups. The pizzas were then cooked and transported with the children to their next venue of the day - The Fitzwilliam Museum. After enjoying their pizza lunch, the class were taken to look at a very large clay owl, looking at his eyes, ears, claws and beak. They thought of adjectives to describe each part and then worked together to create a class poem. The children then looked at a few paintings of ships and boats at sea, again composing a class poem. In contrast the class were then shown a painting with a mother, child and skeleton. The children noticed so much in this poem and thought of some lovely words to describe some of the objects. Finally, the children explored the gallery and chose a painting to study before composing their own individual poem.
