Dear Children and Parents,

Welcome back everyone! I hope that you have all enjoyed a super Christmas break and are feeling rested and ready for an exciting and busy term ahead. Mrs Robson, Miss Hitchings, Mrs Munday and I would like to express our gratitude for the cards, gifts and kind words that we received at the end of the autumn term, it is greatly appreciated.

### Class Topic

Our topic this term is 'Ancient Maya.' Through this topic the children will learn about Maya communication, beliefs and civilization. They will be encouraged to make links to what they have learnt about early Britain during the autumn term. It is hoped that the topic will be enriched by a visit from Widget Workshops at some point during the term. More information about this proposed activity, including cost, will follow in due course. Please see the accompanying topic web for more details of what your child will be learning across the curriculum. If your child has a book or object of interest that links directly to our topic or something that has been taught, they may bring it into school, with the understanding that there will not always be time for them to share with the class.

Following our recent 'Idea's Den' initiative, a trip to Hertfordshire Zoo has also been arranged for Class Three. This promises to be an exciting day out and will help to prepare and engage children ahead of their summer term geography, which focuses on rainforests and conservation. A detailed trip letter will be shared soon.

### Staffing

As last term, I will be teaching Class 3 every day, except on Tuesday morning when Mrs Munday will teach the class. Mrs Robson and Miss Hitchings are the teaching assistants in Class 3. Mrs Robson will be in class on Monday and Friday and Miss Hitchings will be in on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

### Homework and Planners

As last term, children in Class 3 will have one maths task and spelling homework each week. Homework will be set on Fridays and due the following Friday. Maths will usually be a sheet or online activity; weekly spellings will be stuck into planners and there may be an additional worksheet or online activity to support learning of the spellings/spelling pattern. On Fridays, completed homework will be collected and children will have a spelling and times table test. Daily reading remains a priority and even if your child is a fluent reader, they should still read aloud to an adult for 10 minutes every day. All reading should be recorded in their planner. Every Friday children will prepare their planner for the following week, they will be given notice of upcoming events and any changes to the usual routine and reminded about which times table they should focus on. Please promote your child's independence by regularly asking them about what they need for school and encouraging them to refer to their planner. Parents must sign and date the planner each week. Planners will usually be checked on a Friday but should be in school every day.

The book should be returned to class promptly in order that your child can share their work and pass the book on.
